Expanding Capacity

Home Building Foundation helped add capacity to shelters. Over **845** individuals each year find shelter in a facility HBF has built or renovated.

Securing Donations

Home Building Foundation helped secure **\$450,550** in product donations of construction labor and materials to help alleviate the costs for shelter projects in 2023. On average, this **saves the shelter between 30-70%** of the total retail cost of the project.





Capital Contributions

Home Building Foundation provided cash contributions for shelter projects. In 2023, HBF donated **\$119,700** in cash grants to support these projects.

Workforce Training & Scholarships

Home Building Foundation awarded scholarships for students working towards a career in the home building industry. Over **\$315,000** has been awarded in scholarships to date. Nearly **\$25,000** of in-kind materials have been donated to local high school programs.

DEAR FRIENDS,

Home Building Foundation (HBF) was founded in 1997 by the Home Building Association (HBA) of Greater Portland. HBF harnesses the resources and expertise of the home building industry to build and renovate shelters for people experiencing homelessness in our community. As an affiliate of HomeAid, we do this through a unique approach that finds builders and remodelers through the HBA and others in the industry who donate or heavily discount labor and material. This allows our service providers to put more money into their programs to help people in our community. In 2024, we are excited to work with A Village for One to build a second home for girls escaping sexual exploitation as well as a 60-bed expansion for Just Compassion of East Washington County. Several other projects are in our pipeline for later in the year along with many volunteer days.

HBF is also committed to building the workforce of the future through scholarships and educational opportunities for people interested in careers in the home building industry. HBF aims to reduce income inequality by providing a more diverse group of people skilled training for sustainable construction careers. We've recruited eleven high schools with construction programs whose students will support our shelter projects by building sheds, picnic tables, fences and more.



Project Homeless Connect

Shelter Provider: Project Homeless Connect of Washington County

Shelter Location: Downtown Hillsboro

Builder Captain: Home Building Foundation

Project Details: HBF worked with PHC to renovate its popular Day Center that serves as the organization's primary outreach facility. With help from professional builders such as Mountainwood Homes, Lennar, National Women in Roofing, and Rick's Custom Fencing and Decking, HBF was able to completely transform the property by adding a wheelchair ramp, fencing, landscaping, storage sheds, new appliances and a new roof.



Shelter Provider: Yamhill Community Action Partnership

Shelter Location: Newberg

Builders Captain: Nathan D Young Construction

Project Details: HBF teamed up with Nathan D Young Construction to renovate the former Harvest House, re-structured as a navigational center in addition to its historic role as an overnight shelter with 25 beds. HBF worked with interior designer Casework to come up with welcoming colors and materials for the revamped shelter. Donors such as RidgeCrest Custom Cabinetry, Eastbank Contractor Appliances, Budget Blinds of McMinnville, Clean It Up Mark! and Fireside Home Solutions helped supply materials and labor for the project that was completed in December.

Oleson Woods & Greenburg Oaks

Shelter Provider: Community Partners for Affordable Housing

Shelter Location: SW Portland/Tigard

Builder Captain: Home Building Foundation

Project Details: HBF signed on to help CPAH improve communal and outdoor nature spaces at two of its affordable housing properties. HBF began in March 2023 leading volunteer groups to remove invasive species, rebuild nature pathways and reconstruct split rail fencing at Oleson Woods – a 32-unit permanent, supportive housing development. In 2024, HBF will pivot to fixing the outdoor community space at the 84-unit Greenburg Oaks.

Forest Ridge

Shelter Provider: A Village For One

Shelter Location: Undisclosed

Builders Captain: Jim Standring/Westland Industries

Project Details: With Jim Standring as builder, HBF is building the second home for AV41 after completing the Anisa's Place shelter in 2020. AV41 serves teenage girls aged 12 to 17 recovering from commercial sexual exploitation, a major issue in Oregon in large part because the state ranks number one in child homelessness in the nation. The new shelter, dubbed Forest Ridge, will provide additional beds to the growing non-profit.

Just Compassion

Shelter Provider: Just Compassion of East Washington County

Shelter Location: Tigard

Builder Captain: Walsh Construction

Project Details: HBF is teaming up again with Just Compassion to build out a new two-story shelter space adjacent to the Resource Center that HBF and its partners helped build in 2019. The new space will provide 60 transitional and emergency shelter beds for homeless adults as well as office, meeting, and dining spaces.

High School Outreach

Home Building Foundation is proud to connect with 38 high school construction programs in the Greater Portland area. Here are 2023 Education Partnership Program highlights:

Sherwood High School students built benches, and Glencoe High students donated seating to Cultivate Initiatives. Holt Homes employees taught Reynolds Learning Academy students how to build a coffee cart. All of the student-built items are now the centerpiece of Cultivate's waiting area for its work program.

Students at Glencoe High built two sheds for our remodel at Project Homeless Connect (PHC). The sheds help PHC store more donations from the public.

Students at Cleveland, Franklin, Grant, Merlo Station, Mountainside and Roosevelt High Schools built picnic tables with wood donated by HBF and building suppliers. All Portland Safe Rest Villages now have tables donated from our Education Partnership Program.



Adult Construction Training Programs

HBF supports four adult construction pre-apprenticeship programs: Constructing Hope, Oregon Tradeswomen, P.O.I.C., and Portland Youth Builders, which includes building projects for area nonprofits.

Platform Building Project

Constructing Hope trainees learned framing lessons from HBF's Project Manager Chris McDowell, building 8'x10' wooden platforms for tents at Portland's largest Safe Rest Village. This project saved thousands of public dollars.


Project Homeless Connect - Wheelchair Ramp Build

Constructing Hope's fall cohort worked alongside employees of Rick's Custom Fencing to frame and build a needed wheelchair ramp and other improvements. The trainees provided 240 hours of labor.

Employment Connections

HBF and HBA encourages trainees from the four pre-apprenticeship programs to pursue sustainable construction careers, such as this meet- and -greet at the 2023 HBA BuildRight conference. We are connecting with more than 400 trainees annually.
